Tear gas fired, farmers injured at Punjab-Haryana border

Protesting farmers of various unions on Wednesday started marching towards the national capital. The Delhi Police deployed at the borders are as of now guarding the borders and ensuring the maintenance of law and order amid the farmers' 'Delhi chalo' call. A massive deployment of police and paramilitary personnel besides multi-layered barricading is in place to seal the national capital borders at Singhu, Tikri and Ghazipur. Central Delhi has been put under a heavy security cover with personnel in anti-riot gears deployed strategically and metal and concrete barricades regulating access to several key roads. On Tuesday the Delhi Metro regulated passengers' entry and exit at nine stations by shutting some gates for several hours in view of the farmers' march towards the national capital. Police deployed tear gas to halt thousands of farmers demanding minimum crop prices from advancing towards the capital New Delhi following unsuccessful negotiations with the government. Thick clouds of tear gas were dispersed to scatter protesters at the Shambhu border near Ambala, situated approximately 200 kilometers north of the capital. Additionally, police employed drones to drop tear gas canisters from the air. While the police are not actively impeding the movement of farmers from the state towards Delhi, a state of high alert has been declared in Punjab, with approximately 70% of the entire state police force instructed to remain on duty in the field. Why are farmers protesting and what are their demands? The farmers are staging a large-scale protest to compel the Center to acknowledge their list of demands. The farm organizations are calling for legislation to ensure a minimum support price (MSP), a requirement they had stipulated in 2021 when they consented to end their protest against the now-repealed farm laws. Additionally, the farmers are pressing for the enforcement of the Swaminathan Commission's recommendations, pensions for farmers and agricultural workers, as well as the forgiveness of farm debts. As per the farmers, the Center ought to ensure "justice" for the victims of the Lakhimpur Kheri violence.

Punjab to Delhi: Where does farmers' protest stand on Day 2?

The day after farmers began their 'Delhi Chalo' march, the Delhi Police has put up barricades, concrete blocks and razor wires at entry points to stop the protesters. Several entry points to Delhi at borders with Haryana and Uttar Pradesh remain blocked for the second day of farmers' march to the national capital to pressurise the BJP government into accepting their demands. Preparatory barricades and traffic diversions have added woes to commuters in Delhi even as the protesters fight policemen to breach defences at the Punjab-Haryana border at Shambhu. Hundreds of farmers with their tractor trolleys began their march around 10 am on Wednesday from Fatehgarh Sahib to Delhi via the Shambhu border, as per ground inputs. While another group of protestors is moving towards the national capital from Mehal Kalan in Sangrur through Khanauri border. Scuffles between police and protesters have also been reported at the Shambhu border and



Data Singh border in Jind. Authorities in Haryana have fortified the state's border with Punjab at many places in Ambala, Jind, Fatehabad, Kurukshetra and Sirsa using concrete blocks, barbed wires and iron nails to scuttle the proposed march. Pictures from the ground on Tuesday showed thick clouds of tear gas being used to disperse protesters near the city of Ambala, about 200km north of

Supreme Court Collegium Recommends Transfer Of 3 High Court Judges

The Supreme Court collegium headed by Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud has recommended to the Centre the transfer of three high court judges on their request. In a meeting held on Tuesday, the collegium, also comprising Justices Sanjiv Khanna, B R Gavai, Surya Kant and Aniruddha Bose, accepted the request of Calcutta HC judge Justice Moushumi Bhattacharya seeking a transfer to any other high court. "By a communication dated February 12, 2024, Ms Justice Moushumi Bhattacharya has sought a transfer from the High Court at Calcutta to any other High Court for personal reasons. The Collegium accedes to the request and resolves to recommend that Ms Justice Moushumi Bhattacharya be transferred, in the interests of the better administration of justice, to the High Court for the State of Telangana," the collegium said. It also accepted the request of Justice Anu Sivaraman who has sought a transfer out of the State of Kerala. The collegium accedes to the request and resolves to recommend that Ms. Justice Anu Sivaraman be transferred, in the interests of the better administration of justice, to the Karnataka High Court," it said. In another decision, the collegium said that it received a communication dated February 12, 2024, from Justice Sujoy Paul seeking a transfer on the ground that his son is practising in the High Court of Madhya Pradesh.
